MULTIPLIER EVENTS IN THESSALONIKI AND PORTOROŽ



During the third multiplier event, held in Thessaloniki, Greece, the different phases of creating the e-learning platform were presented. This meeting particularly highlighted the progress and results obtained in developing the ECVET profile, as well as in drawing up the training plan and teaching manual.

On the other hand, at the fourth multiplier event, held in Portorož, Slovenia, the main achievements to date were highlighted and the upcoming training programs, focused on digital resilience and digital security, were introduced.

These multiplier events serve as informative spaces that allow participants to familiarize themselves with the objectives of the TREADS project. At the same time, they are key instruments for gathering comments and contributions, which help to improve and guide the development of the different actions of the project.

This meeting provided an opportunity to review the project's progress and strengthen collaboration between the consortium partners. The meeting also highlighted the importance of face-to-face meetings to improve communication, planning, and team cohesion.



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KEY PROGRESS IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF TREADS TRAINING

Another significant progress in the **TREADS** project has been the completion of several key tasks that contribute to ensuring the continuity and fulfillment of the project's objectives.

In this regard, the development of the ECVET curriculum aimed at training digitally skilled and resilient tourism experts, capable of identifying digital risks and adapting to the continuous transformations in the tourism sector and society, has been completed. This work has also included the development of a training plan in manual format, designed to support vocational training centers and trainers in the creation and development of specialized courses.
